

1. **Will the EPA renew its request to the Army to conduct tests of water and/or fish in Kendaia, Reeder and/or Indian creeks between the border of the former Seneca Army Depot and Seneca Lake? What other actions, if any, does the EPA plan in response to further evidence that PFAS contamination from the former Seneca Army Depot has clean pathways to Seneca Lake?**
 - a. The US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) is the lead agency for the site. USACE is following the [Superfund CERCLA process](#) and conducting PFAS investigations starting at the areas of potential concern on the base. If those investigations determine that PFAS may be leaving the base and impacting off-site receptors, USACE will be asked to sample the creeks to define the nature and extent of contamination.
2. **Comment on the recent SLPWA/FLI study?**
 - a. While EPA acknowledges the important work being done by community organizations like the Seneca Lake Pure Waters Association, we cannot provide comment on their study as we were not involved in the sampling or analysis process.

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
